Dear Board of Management Members,

I have completed the audit of the Association's financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2025 and in respect of which, have issued an unmodified audit opinion.

The responsibility for the implementation and maintenance of an effective internal control system rests with management. In the performance of my audit I reviewed only those systems and controls upon which reliance could be placed. Therefore, the scope of my audit did not include a comprehensive review of all the financial and operational procedures, systems and controls within the organisation and as such the Board of Management should not rely on this review to locate potential weaknesses that may exist within the system. The following comments should not be regarded as a comprehensive statement of all matters that may exist.

1. Financial Liquidity

Due to the revenue from the AFP Grant, the Association has maintained its ability to pay its debts as and when they fall due, as indicated by the working capital ratio.

The Associations working capital position is at a high level and certainty can be placed on the Associations capability to meet its debts, obligations and future spending as and when they fall due.

The Board of Management has also committed to retaining a buffer of at least \$25,000 in the Association's bank accounts throughout each financial year.

2. Standard of Accounting Records

The accounting records of the Association are of a satisfactory standard and have improved over the past few years. The Board of Management is proactive in the finances of the Association, and this helps to ensure accurate and timely financial reports can be prepared.

Cash recording is still an area that requires constant monitoring, as theft has the greatest chance of occurring from these transactions. For this reason, cash transactions must be accurately recorded and the monies banked promptly. As discussed previously, minimising cash transactions is an effective way to mitigate the risk of fraud occurring.

3. Review of Controls

As a result of the small size of the finance function within the ACT Neighbourhood Watch Association Inc, it is not possible to segregate all finance roles. Therefore, it is particularly important that the Board of Management is proactive in reviewing financial information and monitoring results against expectation, as this may assist in the detection of irregularities including error and fraud.

4. Annual Information Statement

I would like to remind the Board of Management of the need to lodge an Annual Information Statement with the Australia Charities and Not-for-profits Commission ('ACNC'). This can be facilitated through the Associations unique login details to the ACNC website. Please note that the Annual Information Statement is due by 31 January 2026, along with the financial report.

5. Change of Board of Management

I would like to remind the Board of Management of the need to update Responsible Persons in ACNC when there is a change to the Board of Management members.

Charities have a duty to notify the ACNC of changes each and every time a Responsible Person (i.e., a board member) takes on or finishes a role as a Responsible Person. This includes any change in their role - for example, if an ordinary board member at your charity becomes treasurer.

You must provide information of all board members to be listed as Responsible Persons, not just office bearers like the president, vice president or treasurer. Include both office bearers and ordinary board members.

To update these details, you can log into the ACNC Charity Portal.

6. Annual GST Return

The association's annual GST return has been prepared based on the information that has been provided to us.

We have extracted the relevant information from the financial statements and performed reconciliations of both GST Collected and GST Paid.

We estimate that the amount of \$3,985 will be refundable to the association for the year ended 30 June 2025.

7. Retained profits

For the financial year ended 30 June 2025 the Association made a loss of \$6,953.

The majority of the retained profits have been retained in the association's bank accounts (as at 30 June 2025, cash at bank totaled \$78,863). While this provides very good liquidity, it should be ensured that attention is focused on meeting the objectives of the Association. As stated in your Constitution, the principal object of ACT Neighbourhood Watch Association Inc is to promote a sense of safety, security and wellbeing in the Australian Capital Territory community.

It should be ensured that high excesses of cash are being used to fund the objects of the Association or that you have plans in place for the use of these funds in the future.

If there are plans to use these funds in the future, this should be minuted at your Board of Management meetings.

8. Replacement of Signage

During the 2025 financial year, the Association began work on the replacement of all Neighbourhood Watch signage across the ACT. This is a progressive program and will continue over the next several financial years. However, there was an initial outlay of funds spent on signage during the 2025 financial year.

9. Lease of 2 Gratton Court, Wanniassa ACT

On 1 May 2025 the Association entered a 5-year lease for the premises at 2 Gratton Court, Wanniassa at an expected ongoing cost of approximately \$7,000 p.a.

10. Area NHW Bank Accounts

The total amount held in Area NHW bank accounts at 30 June 2025 was \$10,626.98. The bank accounts for the Areas have not previously been included in the financial statements of the Association until closure and transfer of funds to the main Association bank account. However, for completeness going forward the bank account balances for Areas which remain

open have been included in the current assets of the Association at 30 June 2025 and going forward.

Notes to the Financial Statements

ACT Neighbourhood Watch Association Incorporated For the year ended 30 June 2025

The financial statements cover ACT Neighbourhood Watch Association Incorporated as an individual entity. ACT Neighbourhood Watch Association Incorporated is a not-for-profit association incorporated in ACT under the Associations Incorporation Act 1991 ('the Act').

The principal activities of the association during the financial year were:

- Providing newsletters, web and social media posts to the residents of Canberra to inform them of:
 - Current activities
 - Crime statistics
 - Where they can report crime and community safety issues, and
 - How they benefit by caring for their neighbours.
- Promoting personal and property safety and security at community events.

These activities help the Association to promote a sense of safety, security and wellbeing in the ACT community and meet the Objectives of the Association, being:

- (a) Encourage residents' involvement in the safety, security and well being of their community.
- (b) Channel community concerns to the appropriate authorities.
- (c) Actively assist in the promotion of mutual cooperation and caring between neighbours.
- (d) Minimize the incidence of preventable crime in the community.
- (e) Increase the incidence of reporting crime and suspicious activity within the Neighbourhood Watch Area to the Police.
- (f) Improve the level of personal, household, and community security in the Neighbourhood Watch Area through an ongoing education campaign.
- (g) Encourage individuals within the community to appropriately identify their property.

1. Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Board of Management, ACT Neighbourhood Watch Association Incorporated is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Income Tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.



Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Interest Revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.
