

Reporting suspicious activity

Suspicious behaviour can refer to incidents, events, individuals or anything that appears to be unusual or out of place.

Every piece of information regarding suspicious behaviour is important. It may seem insignificant to you, but it could prove vital to an investigation, arrest and prosecution – so try to take note of the following:

- gender
- approximate age
- hair - colour / style
- build - body frame / height
- appearance – complexion / clothes / facial hair/ tattoos / glasses
- voice – language / speech
- vehicle - number plate / make / colour / model / condition / direction of travel
- anything suspicious being carried, for example a bike / computer

What you should do

- if it is an **emergency** dial **000**
- contact **ACT Policing** on **131 444** if you require police assistance because you are witnessing a crime
- keep calm
- report where and what is happening
- stay on the phone
- note time, date and any of the above descriptions
- if you can safely do so, keep watching
- if you have information on suspicious behaviour or criminal activity, call **Crime Stoppers** on **1800 333 000** or make an online report at crimestoppersact.com.au

NHW aims to reduce the incidence of preventable crime, particularly property crimes and crimes against the person.

It involves a group of residents working together to promote a sense of safety, security and well-being in a neighbourhood.

- distributes crime prevention messages
- seeks to improve and monitor the levels of personal safety and household security in any given local area
