

## PERSONAL

- Be aware of who is around you.
- Stay secure outdoors by walking in crowded, well-lit areas.
- Carry a personal alarm when out at night and practise using it.



## BUSINESS

- Install security cameras, locks and a distress alarm.
- Install electronic beepers that sound when people enter and exit the business.
- Be aware of fraud or theft from employees, suppliers and customers.
- Train staff on emergency procedures and legal requirements e.g. bag searching, refusing entry, power of arrest etc.
- Register your business with ACT Policing's ACT Keyholder Register.

# TIPS ON HOW YOU CAN TAKE ACTION TO PROTECT YOURSELF AND YOUR PROPERTY

## HOME

- Lock doors and windows even when you're at home.
- Put a lock on your side/back gate and letterbox.
- Install sensor lights that turn on with movement.
- Install a peephole in your door and a light outside so you can see who is there without opening the door.
- Get to know your neighbours and who lives nearby; look out for each other.



## ONLINE

- Change your passwords regularly and don't share them.
- Always look for a padlock symbol next to the web address to ensure you are on a secure site.
- Don't be a victim of a scam or spam emails.
- Don't open emails that you're not sure of.
- Be aware of how much personal information you reveal.



## CHILDREN

- Encourage them to walk in groups and never alone.
- Know where they are at all times. Where possible pick them up and drop them off.
- Use parent controls on electronic devices.
- Talk with them about what's going on in their lives.
- Teach them not to share personal information or images online with people they don't know.
- Practise role playing stranger danger scenarios with them regularly.

## VEHICLE

- Always lock your car.
- Do not leave items of value in your car.
- Secure your number plate with tamper proof screws.



## BICYCLE

- Lock it before you leave it in a public place.
- Record your bike's details and take a photo of it.
- Secure it in a locked garage when not in use.



## PROPERTY

- Identify all items of value by marking them with your licence number and take photos.
- Keep an inventory of all items of value, inside and outside of the house.
