It might be winter but Neighbourhood Watch has not been hibernating. Here are just some of the activities happening.

19 July: ACT Neighbourhood Watch Members' workshop on antiscams. Attended by about 20 members and representatives from ACT Policing. A useful and practical session to avoid being caught out by scammers.

29 July: Anti-scam community forum hosted by Alicia Payne and guest speaker the Hon Stephen Jones MP, Assistant Treasurer and Minister for Financial Services.

The Forum was attended by about 350 people all keen to hear what they can do as individuals to limit their risk of exposure to scams and what action is being taken on the issue.

July/August/September: ACTNHW, ACT Policing and MCCI are working together to provide various seniors multi-cultural groups with information about community safety, scams and reporting incidents and suspicious behaviour. Sessions are being held, sometimes with the assistance of an interpreter, with Chinese, Indian, Vietnamese, Serbian, Italian and Korean community groups who meet socially each week as part of the MCCI program.

ACTNHW signage update: After 40 years it is to be expected that some of the organisation's suburban signs need to be replaced or refreshed. Work has already commenced in some areas of Belconnen and our team will shortly looking at signs in the Ainslie, Hackett, Watson, Dickson and Downer areas. The signs are usually

HACKETT PROFILE MAUREEN CUMMUSKEY



Maureen was born in Hong Kong. She enjoyed her 16 years there – good friends, safe environment. Her father was a Chief Engineer on a British merchant ship, and on school holidays took his

wife and only daughter travelling with him to Osaka, Borneo, Rangoon and Calcutta.

Her father retired at 55 years, and the family went to Sydney (UK was too cold for a man who had always worked in warm countries). Maureen trained in a business college for a year, and then became a private secretary in a succession of places over 3 years. In addition to working, she became involved in British and Irish folk music, initially as a spectator and very soon after as a performer at folk clubs and festivals. In 1974 a Canberra musician friend was asked to put together a bush band for a contract to perform at the Lakeside Hotel each weekend for two months, and he invited Maureen to be part of the band.

Maureen liked Canberra so she moved here, obtaining secretarial work through an agency. She joined the Monaro Folk Music Society and went on to serve on the committee as the newsletter editor and then President. She continued performing in Canberra, and when the solo support musician for Billy Connolly fell ill, she was invited to replace him. This led to more support acts for visiting celebrities. She remembers a 4-gig tour with Phyllis Dillon – who was reserved when wearing a full-length mink coat, and became a raucous comedian in a short dress with diamonds, with wild hair and a cackling laugh, when the coat was removed. A very generous fee led to Maureen singing at a women's night at a Belconnen football club, with a male strip show, football players dressed as slaves and over 400 screaming women. After 10 minutes of performing, when she couldn't hear herself singing, she and her agent agreed that she may as well leave!

The next adventure was the formation of a women's theatre company. A 12 month Community Employment Program grant led to

"Women on a Shoestring", directed by Camilla Blunden, with 10 actors, singers and musicians, appear in Canberra, and the Adelaide and Sydney fringe festivals.

After this Maureen joined the Public Service. With the Women's Bureau of the Department of Employment and Industrial Relations, for four years she edited the newsletter "Women and Work". Each newsletter had a theme – sport, music, and such; she travelled extensively interviewing those she had chosen to feature. In the Communications branch of the Education Department she was Event Manager for government Ministers, organizing a variety of events in Canberra and Sydney. Her singing continued. She co-formed a 5-piece women's band "Salvation Jane", singing evenings and weekends, at Canberra, Sydney and at the coast. The band became well known and had a monthly residency at the Dickson Pub. The band continued for three years.

Maureen retired from the Public Service in 2009. She and her partner owned a house in O'Connor. In 2015 it was declared to be a Mr. Fluffy house, and they had to join many others seeking to buy a replacement home. They settled in Hackett. Maureen enjoys visiting the theatre, particularly for experimental plays, and listening to folk music. Travelling is a regular pleasure.

Wear sturdy shoes and clothes which cover your limbs, preferably fabric with a smooth surface to resist burrs. Bring sun protection, drinking water, and garden gloves if you have them.
