## **School Rules for Drivers**

As thousands of giddy kindergarteners start the 2021 school year, ACT Policing will also be out targeting speeders especially around school zones. 40km/h speed limits are once again in effect in school zones between 8am and 4pm.

Detective Inspector Marcus Boorman said "School zones are busy areas with high amounts of pedestrian traffic, particularly on the first week of school as parents are there with the new students,"

"In 2020, the number of fines issued in school zones by police fell by almost half to 297 and I want to see this trend continue into 2021,"

"Police will be out enforcing the full penalties for those who choose to speed in school zones, an act which could have life-altering consequences."

# **Explore the Great Outdoors - Safely**

ACT Policing is urge all Canberrans to stay safe when exploring the great outdoors this summer.

Officer in Charge of Rural Patrol Detective Acting Inspector Simon Coady said "If after a year of quarantine, isolation and COVID-19 restrictions, you are keen to escape the city for a breath of fresh air, make sure you pack enough supplies, download the Emergency+ app and make sure you tell someone where you are going,"

"While many people may be giving hiking a go for the first time, it is important everyone, including experienced hikers, ensure they are well prepared before setting off on an outdoor adventure."

"Once you're out in the bush, stay on the signposted tracks and keep an eye on the weather so you don't get caught out."

ACT Emergency Services Agency (ACTESA) Commissioner Georgeina Whelan said when exploring through the bush, always check weather conditions and the fire danger rating before you travel. "Take caution when camping, driving or planning to light a cooking fire as small fires can quickly escalate into a major incident in hot and windy conditions."

Each year police and specialist rescue services are called out to assist hikers who are lost, injured or ill prepared for the conditions.

The ACT's numerous national parks span more than 1,302 square kilometres. which diverts a massive amount of emergency services resources from core duties when a search happens.
