## How neighbours can prevent crime

At 12:30pm on Sunday 25 August a group of 6 or 7 youths, approximately around 13 years of age, walked down a small cul-de-sac near Kambah Oval. Residents were alerted to the group due to the barking of neighbour's dogs who recognised that the group were not common to the cul-de-sac.

The youths broke into a house by breaking a window and smashing open a door. Two neighbours having been alerted by the dogs and the noise of breaking windows, came out into the street to determine what was happening within the house.

The youths having seen that they had been identified by the neighbours quickly fled the scene and ran away. Crime Stoppers was called, and it was later found that the youths were in the process of attempting to burn the house down. Fire lighting equipment was found within the house and cupboards and draws had been heaped together in the middle of the kitchen in readiness to ignite.

The close attention of the two neighbours identified the threat, and specifically prevented this deliberate attempt at arson.
