Oxley Mailbox Tampering - Townhouse Grouped Letterboxes

A resident recently witnessed Mailbox Tampering at Hilltop View's townhouse complex. It is a Federal Offence to tamper with another person's mail.

Now most people know that there isn't a Master key that opens all locks, but in the case of grouped letterboxes, it is likely that there is. This is what you should look for to see if your Mailbox/Letterbox is vulnerable to a Master key:



- Your Lock has a number stamped on it : eg R356 , 156 or similar.
- The inside of the lock has a particular shape to the first wafer as seen on the left.
- If you have any of the above, then there is a chance your lock is Master-keyed.

In any case you may obtain a key from any Locksmith by taking in a picture of the lock showing the Number.

What to do? Change your lock out to a new one that does not have a number stamped on it and the wafers inside do not look like the above.

Any decent hardware store or Locksmith should have these. Cost is around \$10 to \$30.00. Or you can upgrade to a better lock for around \$80.00 (DIY)
