### **CURRENT OXLEY ISSUES**

Recent hooning issues have substantially reduced due to Oxley resident's vigilant attention to noting descriptions of vehicles and getting photos and video to Crime Stoppers. ACT Policing assigned a dedicated officer which really helped with information flow.

Tuggeranong Police Operations require residents to call 131 444 when hooning is happening. Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 can be called at any time. All reports can be made anonymously by phone or online. The information that is required is: DATE TIME LOCATION And if possible a description of the vehicle including make/model colour and registration. Keep a journal of incidents.

#### Aggressive Dogs and Dogs off-leash - Please report!

Please click on the Dogs and Community Safety PDF link below.

Dog attacks can be reported 24 hours a day, seven days a week to Access Canberra on 132281. If an attack is in progress call 000. Please note that Oxley Hill is a designated Dog-off-Leash Area. However, it is specified in the Dangerous Dog Legislation of 2017 that it is an offence 'not having effective control of a dog in a public place, whether on or off lead".
