HACKETT PROFILE

Kay Murphy



Kay was born at the old Canberra Hospital, but her family lived in Queanbeyan. Her grandfather had a farm near Michelago, and as a child she

loved the open spaces. She attended Queanbeyan Primary School until the family moved to Canberra, when she transferred to St. Christopher's School (the first Catholic school in Canberra, opposite the site where St. Christopher's Cathedral now stands; it existed until other Catholic schools were built in Canberra). Her secondary education was at Canberra Catholic Girls High School, now Merici, where she was one of the first pupils.

She began nursing training at Canberra Hospital – a three-year live-in course. But when she needed to become her mother's carer she could not live at the hospital, so was unable to complete the course.

She married in 1967, and she and her husband moved into Hackett. They had three sons. After 10 years not working, she took a part-time job at Canberra Aged Care Home in Lyneham. Kay realized that she was very attracted to working with the elderly, and after some years she took a course in Diversional Therapy. She is now still working at the Home.

Kay became President of the Hackett
Preschool Parents and Friends Association
when her first son started at the Preschool.
The committee wished to raise funds for the
Preschool and asked the Hackett School if
they would join them in staging an Art and
Craft Exhibition. Four mums from the
Preschool, becoming firm friends, organized
the Exhibition, which was highly successful.
The next year, with the children moving from
Preschool onto Hackett School and Rosary
School, Rosary School was asked to join the

other two organizations in running an Exhibition and they happily agreed. This led to further cooperation between them in Health Education. Other schools followed in establishing Art Shows. Kay moved on to run an Art Show at Daramalan College. Hackett Art Show ended when the Hackett school was closed.

A friend asked Kay if she would help at the Hackett Party at the Shops, organised by the Hackett Community Association to celebrate Hackett turning 40. It was a great party. Kay ran the raffle, and found that all Hackett businesses responded generously to her request for donations. She has run a raffle at all the subsequent Hackett Parties at the Shops. Music in the Park, held annually for many years in the Bragg Street Park, was another event that she felt provided an opportunity to strengthen community friendships.

Kay remembers when the Hackett shops included a butcher, a doctor, a pharmacy, a hairdresser, a newsagent and the Owl supermarket. There were tennis courts over the road from the shops. Kay was an enthusiastic tennis player – as a child piano lessons were happily replaced by tennis lessons. She lives now with one of her sons, enjoys many friendships, has four grandchildren, and sees the value of efforts to enhance community connections.

Third Sunday Working Bee 19 October 9am - 12noon

Meeting at the nature park entrance, Tay and Ian Nicol Sts, North Watson, to weed, mulch or seed at The Fair. Bring sun protection, drinking water and gardening gloves if you have them. We provide gloves, tools, buckets, grass seeds. And a cake for morning tea.

We will use small mattocks to loosen soil and remove any weeds like Paterson's Curse, then spread native grass seeds and cover with a light scatter of mulch to hold the seeds in place. This activity is suitable for children. For more information and a map see <u>majura.org</u>

HACKETT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Defibrillator for the Hackett shops Service One Mutual Ltd (credit union) developed the '<u>Streetbeat</u>' program to install life-saving Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) publicly available 24/7 across the ACT. AEDs can be used when someone (young to elderly) is having a sudden cardiac arrest.

As advised in the September newsletter, the HCA has reached its target to have one installed at the shops. The HCA recently met with the Streetbeat program and an ACT Government officer and agreed to have the AED installed outside the IGA store on the paved area. Installation should be sometime in October, followed by an opening event at which we will have St John Ambulance Australia to show how to use it – they also have a 30 minute online workshop about how to use the AED.
