HACKETT PROFILE MARY ANN KULH



Mary Ann was born in Yangon, Myanmar, one of 5 children. Her mother was a senior internal medicine specialist at a Yangon General Hospital, her father was a civil engineer.

When she was 6 yrs, her parents decided

to leave Myanmar so that there would be better education opportunities for their children. Her father met an Australian engineer visiting Myanmar, and he sponsored the family to come to Australia as migrants. Mary Ann remembers her delight arriving in Sydney two days before Christmas to find that St Vincent de Paul had organized, in the rental house set up for them, a Christmas tree with presents for all the children.

After local primary school, for secondary education Mary Ann attended James Ruse Agricultural College, a selective school that had the best academic performance of the state. She studied the sciences, then went on to Sydney University to take a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery degree. She was active in the university social life, taking part in the annual medical school theatrical reviews. In year 5 of her medical degree she chose to take as an elective subject three months in a Yangon Children's Hospital. It was a chance for her to meet her extensive family. Many of the staff at the hospital had memories of her mother. By the end of her degree she had decided that she wanted to be a geriatrician.

She met Steve, her future husband, at university. He studied Economics. She had met him before when they both attended James Ruse College.

On completing her degree Mary Ann became an intern at Royal North Shore Hospital, then a resident for 2 years, then completed her fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians. She was seconded to smaller hospitals in five coastal towns in her training. She enjoyed the beach and began learning how to surf.

With one year of specialist training completed, she and Steve spent five months travelling in South America, then to the UK where Mary Ann worked as a specialist registrar in Rheumatology. She found that in the National Health Service the work hours were even longer than in Australia; some shifts were 36 hours long. She was often fatigued, and overwhelmed. She and Steve returned to Australia; the choice of Canberra was partially influenced by a look at the ANU Mountaineering Club website; Steve enjoyed rock climbing, she enjoyed skiing.

They bought their first house in Hackett, and their two children were born . Mary Ann worked at the Canberra Hospital, and completed her last 2 years of specialist training, qualifying as a geriatrician. She became Director of a new unit, Medical Assessment and Planning Unit (MAPU), set up to ensure that people presenting to Emergency with acute medical problems had specialist assessment within 24 - 48 hours of admission.

Mary Ann also set up a private practice as a geriatrician. This evolved into the practice More than Medicine, providing geriatric medicine, cardiology, respiratory and renal medicine. Steve left work temporarily to become the children's primary carer. He has introduced the children to the outdoor pursuits of orienteering, mountain biking, fishing, surfing, rock climbing and bush walking.

In 2017 Mary Ann moved to North Canberra Hospital, as Director of MAPU. She maintains her private practice. As a clinical Associate Professor she teaches medical students at the ANU. With the Royal Australasian College of Physicians she examines doctors who are training to become specialists.

In free time, between 6 and 7am, Mary Ann rides her road bike with a group called True Grit. Weekends and holidays include surfing, orienteering and mountain bike riding.
