### **Crime Stats - The Facts**

We recently prepared questions for ACT Policing and Crime Stoppers ACT on the monthly crime statistics that are issued by ACT Policing in relation to Canberra.

Here is some of the information that we learnt:

- The statistics include incidents reported to ACT Policing by Crime Stoppers ACT. They include anything assigned for investigation. If a full report isn't provided, this will not be counted, however, it will be noted for information/intelligence.
- Reported crimes are counted in the statistics. For example, if a person's house is broken into but the perpetrator isn't caught, the break-in will still be included in the statistics.
- Where people are caught on camera attempting to commit offences (but haven't actually committed offences) these incidents should definitely be reported to Crime Stoppers ACT. Footage of attempted crimes helps. The intelligence picture is always important. If there isn't enough to investigate now, there may be in the future.
- The ACT Policing website has some territory-wide statistics available which is broken down monthly into command areas. Our team will undertake some analysis on this data and provide some information in our next newsletter.

#### 1. MONITORING TYPE

**Self-Monitored:** You receive alerts and manage responses.

**Professionally Monitored:** A security company handles alerts and contacts emergency services.

#### 2. EQUIPMENT & FEATURES

Cameras: Indoor/outdoor, night vision, motion detection, two-way audio.

**Sensors:** Door/window, motion, glass break.

**Smart Integration:** Works with smart locks, lights, thermostats, voice assistants.

**Alarms:** Loud sirens, silent alerts, panic buttons.

**DIY Systems:** Easy to install, flexible, often cheaper.

**Professional Installation:** Expert setup, often required for complex systems.

TIP: CONSIDER YOUR TECHNICAL COMFORT AND WHETHER YOU RENT OR OWN YOUR HOME.

#### 4. CONNECTIVITY & RELIABILITY

Wi-Fi Based: Common but vulnerable to outages.

Cellular Backup: Keeps system running during internet/power failures.

**Battery Backup:** Ensures continued operation during blackouts.

■ TIP: LOOK FOR SYSTEMS WITH REDUNDANCY TO STAY PROTECTED IN ALL SCENARIOS.

#### 5. COST & CONTRACTS

**Upfront Costs:** Equipment purchase or rental.

**Monthly Fees:** Monitoring, cloud storage, app access. **Contracts**: Some systems require long-term commitments.

TIP: COMPARE TOTAL COST OF OWNERSHIP AND AVOID HIDDEN FEES.
