## What is NHW?

NHW is a community crime prevention program aimed at promoting a sense of safety, security and wellbeing.

It seeks to reduce crime, particularly property crime and offences against the person and aims to promote a secure environment resulting in safe and active neighbourhoods.

Residents are encouraged to keep an eye on their neighbours' properties, particularly if no one is home, and to report any suspicious behaviour to police.

## **Reporting Activity**

Report any suspicious activity, person or vehicle to Crime Stoppers ACT on **1800 333 000** or online at **act.crimestoppers.com.au**.

If a crime is in progress or police attendance is required, it should be reported promptly to the police on **131 444**.

Crimes can also be reported online (preferably) at either the 'report a crime' tab at **www.police.act.gov.au** or the 'report crime online' link at **act.crimestoppers.com.au** or direct to a police station. For record purposes, we encourage you to also indicate that you are a Neighbourhood Watch participant when reporting incidents or providing information.

It is important to report all suspicious activity no matter how trivial it may appear. A particular incident may be one part of other related incidents, and this report may lead police to apprehend offenders.

## Giving a Good Description - People & Vehicles

Community safety and crime prevention is everyone's responsibility. You can help the police by providing a good description of anyone you see committing a crime or who is acting suspiciously.

When giving a description it is important to build a complete picture of a person from head to toe. Taking note of the features listed on the right hand side of this page will assist.

If you observe a vehicle being used during a crime or suspicious behaviour, it is crucial to take note of relevant details.

The most important thing is...

REPORT REPORT REPORT!

- Gender/Approximate Age
- Haircut and colour
- Body Frame/Build/Approximate Height
- Appearance/Look/Body Language
- Distinguishable Clothing
- Facial Hair
- Scars, tattoos or glasses
- Voice characteristics/speech/language
- Vehicle Registration Number
- Vehicle colour, make or model
- Distinguishable artwork or graphics
- Direction of travel
- Driver/Occupants



We recently held our first community event meeting, which was also attended by ACT Neighbourhood Watch representatives, Crime Stoppers ACT and ACT Police. We would like to give a big thank you to the Hawker Bowling Club for their generous help in hosting the meeting.

We had a fantastic turn-out (about 80 people), with lots of questions and comments from our local community. These ranged from what residents can do to support the ACT Police, to the use of CCTV at home and trends in crime statistics in our area. We heard stories from local residents of their experiences and many shared tips and tricks for making homes safer. A key message was ensuring our homes are secure. One of the Hawker Bowling Club staff members spoke about the benefits of increased security measures and how this has significantly reduced property damage at the Club.

Sergeant Ben Pipe from the Belconnen Police Station spoke about opportunities to help the Police and how important it is to report everything, no matter how small it is. These bits of information can be crucial to help them solve crimes we won't even be aware of. Crime Stoppers ACT explained the process of reporting crimes on their website and gave us some valuable information on the matters to report to them (urgent matters should be reported to the ACT Police while non-urgent ones should be reported to Crime Stoppers).

The police officer mentioned that there has been a large increase in offences at local shops (Hawker, Jamison and Belconnen Mall). While phones, cash and jewellery used to be high on the list pf household items that criminals take, the main item of choice these days is cars.

Cars stolen from people's houses are often used to commit other crimes. Offenders look for easy access points to houses such as open doors or windows and use those opportunities to steal car keys.





## Youth Crime

Youth crime was also discussed at the meeting, noting it has become more prevalent in recent times. Attendees provided some great suggestions to our group, NHW ACT and ACT Police on how to combat this as a broader group and so stay tuned for more information on this topic.

## **NHW Signage**

One of the key items we have addressed since the launch of our new group is to submit a request to renew aged Neighbourhood Watch signs within the Hawker/Weetangera suburbs.

We have requested a number of signs and at the cost of \$150 a pop, NHW ACT may not be able to provide all the ones we have requested so we will review this and apply again in the next financial year.

Keep your eyes out for the new signs being installed during August/September.

### **NHW BBQ**


Another item mentioned was that we are looking at holding a community BBQ when the weather is a bit warmer. This will hopefully be held at one of our local shops, with NHW information being provided and we would ask the Police to drop in to the BBQ to chat with residents.

#### **Suburb Ovals**

One of our local residents mentioned that there has been a number of incidents involving fireworks at some of our local school and sports ovals. On one occasion the fireworks started a backyard fire in Weetangera near the oval. Residents were reminded to provide any information to the Police or Crime Stoppers so the offenders may be apprehended.


#### Canberra Times Focus







